



EQUIFAX SECURITY BREACH

As you might be aware, the Equifax security breach exposed sensitive personal information of more than 143 million American consumers. While this has nothing to do with the Department of Child Support Services, it has everything to do with limiting your potential risks.

Equifax informed the public that the breach occurred from mid-May through July 2017. The hackers accessed people's names, Social Security numbers, birth dates, addresses and driver's license numbers.

We want to remind you that there are steps you can take to help protect your sensitive personal information from being misused:

- Review your credit reports from all three credit reporting agencies

- If you find items you don't understand, call the credit reporting agency
- Put a fraud alert or credit freeze on each of your credit profiles
