Local child support agencies (LCSAs) are being advised to sign up for the E-OSCAR web-based system. As early as September, 2004 some credit reporting agencies will no longer be accepting the paper Universal Data Forms or Consumer Dispute Verifications. The only way to submit these disputes/errors is via E-OSCAR.

Signing up for E-OSCAR is free, however there is a \$30 quarterly fee for up to 120 transactions. There will be a .25 cent charge for each transaction exceeding 120. The State will be paying for the cost of this service. Therefore, to avoid charges, please ensure that the billing information provided is as follows:

Before registering, each LCSA must assign an Administrator who will oversee the county's use of the E-OSCAR web application. The Administrator's role is to: create and maintain passwords, user IDs, queues, sub codes, registration information, and manage E-OSCAR reports.

Each LCSA's Administrator must register their county by following the step-by-step registration process. The Administrator may create as many user IDs as needed within the LCSA at no additional charge. Go to <https://www.e-oscar-web.net> to register.

The Automated Credit Dispute Verifications (ACDV) and the Automated Universal Data (AUD) forms will go through E-OSCAR for tracking, managing, and updating purposes. Therefore, each LCSA must assign a Compliance Officer who will be responsible for ensuring that the county responds to the ACDV in compliance with the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA).
